Aéroports de Paris now among the Global 100

For the first year ever, Aéroports de Paris has joined the group of 100 companies worldwide showing the greatest commitment to sustainable development. Aéroports de Paris ranks 39th in the Global 100, an index published by the independent Canadian company Corporate Knights, which offers consulting services for the media and investors.

Aéroports de Paris, the only airport company in the Global 100, ranks fifth among the eight French businesses listed.

'The addition of Aéroports de Paris to the Global 100 honours our programme of action for sustainable development, which has been in effect for several years,' says Aéroports de Paris Chairman & CEO Augustin de Romanet. 'Our CSR policy is part of our 2011–2015 Strategic Plan. It helps us become more effective while improving the way our company reports on labour, social, and environmental measures. The Global 100 brings together the 100 companies worldwide who show the best performance as measured by twelve key indicators of sustainable development. These indicators track energy production, carbon emissions, the diversity of directors, and investments in innovation, among other elements. The index compares companies from over 22 different countries and all economic sectors.
