Aéroports de Paris and Regus to put up a *business centre* in Orlytech, near Paris-Orly Airport.

Aéroports de Paris and Regus, the world's leading supplier of flexible workplaces, have signed an agreement to roll out a business centre right in the heart of Orlytech Business Park. Operational from July 2015, this new 1,400 sqm workspace will offer business travellers functional offices and meeting rooms, available upon request.

The property of Aéroports de Paris, Orlytech Business Park spans 3 hectares and provides 28,600 sqm of office space and business premises close to Paris-Orly Airport. Delivered at the end of the 1980s, the site is currently undergoing renovations leaded by Aéroports de Paris.

By giving it a new lease of life, the aim is to capitalise on the recent arrival of the T7 tramway (the Villejuif/Athis-Mons line, accessible from the airport terminals) and on the future plans for the new Grand Paris Express underground lines (extension of line 14 from Paris and line 18 connecting Paris-Orly to Plateau de Saclay).

Aéroports de Paris has, thus, undertaken the renovation of the building that will house the Regus site and is also carrying out other important structural projects on the Orly airport site. Examples include modernising the airport with the future construction of a connecting building joining the two Orly Sud and Orly Ouest terminals as well as the development of the Cœur d'Orly business district, of which the first office building will be delivered at the end of 2015.



Beginning this summer, Regus will offer business travellers a functional 1,400 sqm space, fully equipped with technological and IT equipment, which will include the following:

- 62 offices
- 160 workstations
- 2 meeting rooms
- 31 parking spaces

In common with all Regus spaces, associated services—administrative support, switchboard and voicemail services, refreshments, etc—are included in order to remain productive and focused on one's objectives.

Business travellers will, thus, be able to make the most of their trips and continue to work between flights, organise meetings and expand their professional network, all in the confines of Orlytech. Users of this Regus centre include both those working whilst on the move, as well as ADP partners.

"We are delighted about this partnership with Aéroports de Paris, which enables the development of the Regus network within strategic locations such as airport areas. With on-demand work solutions offered at London-Gatwick and Copenhagen airports, and a business centre in Orly-Rungis, Regus is convinced that the time spent travelling on business can be optimised. It is with this objective in mind that we are providing flexible workspaces and fully adaptable services, dependent on the requirements of individual users," states Christophe Burckart, Managing Director of Regus France.

"One of the challenges of our Orlytech property policy is to diversify the occupants and services offered across the site, which is located just a few minutes from the airport and enjoys enhanced attractiveness. This tertiary business park at the gates of Paris is in the southern Paris region's leading economic hub and is ideally connected. Reminiscent of the Business Space available in Hall 2 at the Orly Ouest terminal, this new Regus business centre will be spacious and practical and provide services required by business travellers, who are a strategic target for Paris-Orly Airport," concludes **Francois Cangardel**, **Aéroports de Paris Real-Estate Director**.
