Appointments within Aéroports de Paris Group

Augustin de Romanet, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Aéroports de Paris has made the following appointments:

- For the Group's airports in the Paris region:

Bruno MAZURKIEWICZ has been appointed Managing Director of Paris-Le Bourget Airport and General Aviation Aerodromes, to replace François Charritat, who has been appointed Delegate Director for Environmental & Airport Community Relations, North.

Appointed by Aéroports de Paris Management (ADPM), Bruno Mazurkiewicz had been Chief Executive Officer of Zagreb International Airport in Croatia since 2014. Mr Mazurkiewicz, 54, graduated from the *Université Paris 7 - Ecole des Mines* with a post-graduate degree (DESS) in thermal engineering and regulation. He earned an MBA from the IAE de Paris Sorbonne Business School. In 1986, he joined Aéroports de Paris, where he held various positions and was involved in the commissioning of new terminals at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport. He was the airport's Energy and Logistics Director between 2003 and 2008 before going on secondment as Chief Executive Officer of Airport Terminal Operations Ltd in Mauritius, from 2009 to 2013.

Bruno Mazurkiewicz reports to **Franck Goldnadel**, Deputy Chief Executive Officer, with responsibility for airport operations, and Managing Director of Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport.

- On the occasion of the reorganisation of the Group's centralised engineering, in effect since January 1st 2016:

Jean Roche has been appointed Director of the Project Management Division, to replace Xavier Dubrac, who has been appointed Director of the Feasibility and Programmes Division.

Jean Roche, 49, who holds a degree in mechanical engineering from the *Ecole Centrale de Nantes*, has been with Aéroports de Paris since 4 January 2016. Until 2015, Mr Roche was the Deputy General Manager of CMN (*Constructions Mécaniques de Normandie*). He began his career in 1993 at Alphatem Services, a subsidiary of the Assystem Group, where he was in charge of testing and commissioning complex and at-risk installations. From 1998 to 2006, he worked as a Business Manager for STX France (formerly *Chantiers de l'Atlantique*); his projects included the Millennium and Queen Mary 2 ocean liners. From 2006 to 2014, he was Director of Operations and then General Manager of STX France Lorient.

Jean Roche reports to **Guillaume Sauv e**, Director of the Engineering and Development Division, who in turn reports to **Patrick Jeantet**, Aéroports de Paris Chief Operating Officer.
