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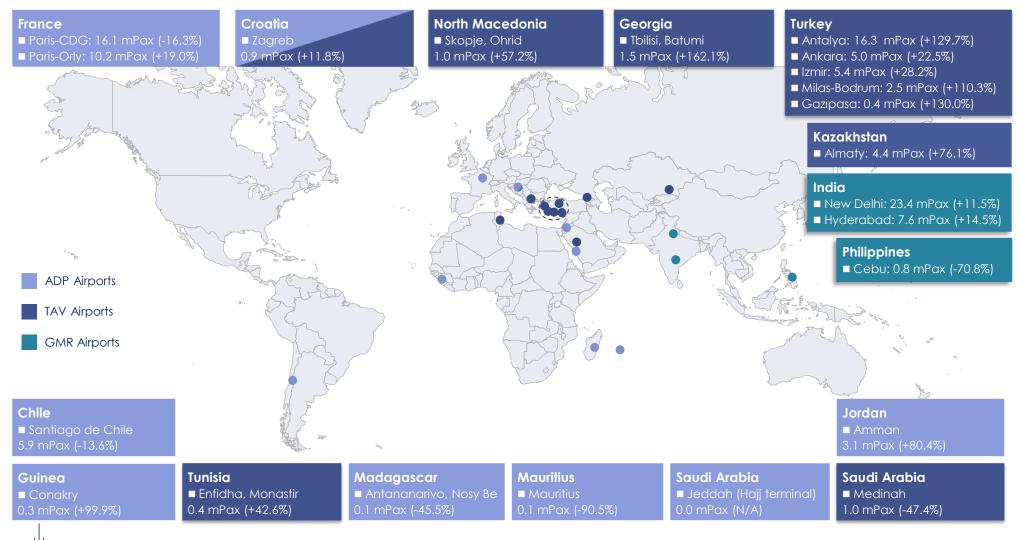

Group traffic over 9M 2021 at 104.9 mPax¹, up by +14.5%, at 39.1% of the 2019 traffic level



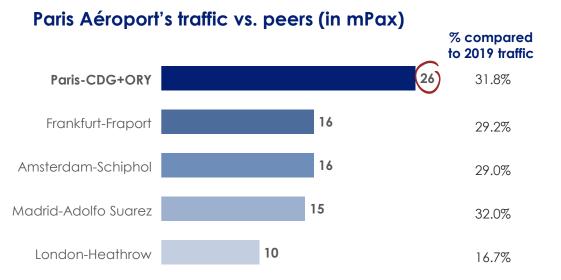

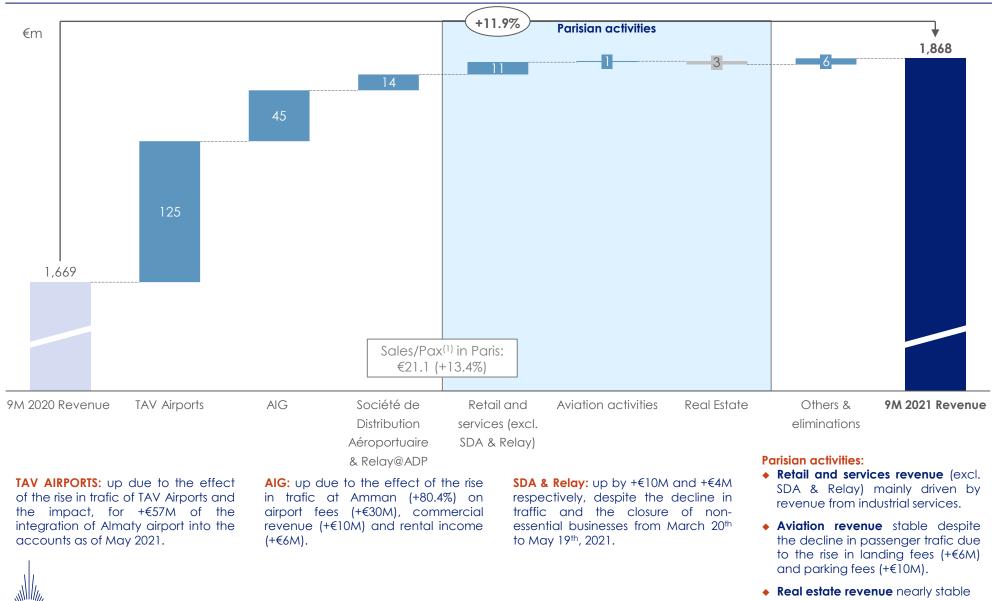

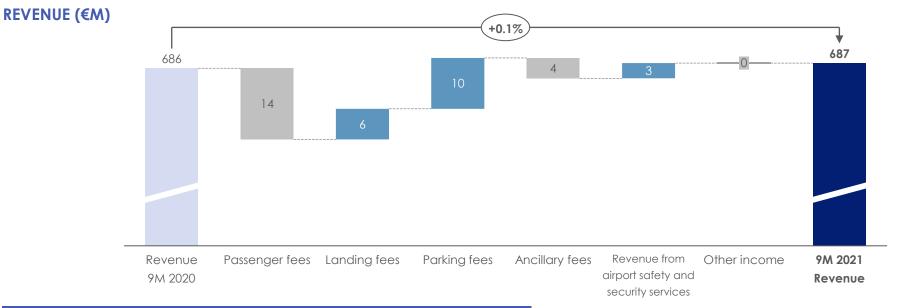

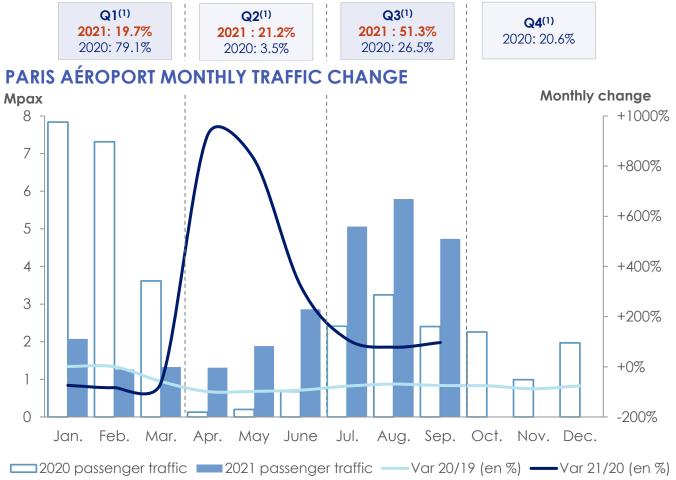
Revenue: stable, at 687 million euros mainly due to:

- The increase in revenue from landing fees (up by +6.5%) and parking fees (+15.7%), more than compensating for the decline in revenue from passenger fees (-7.5%);
- Revenue from airport safety and security services and other income remain stable.
- Paris Aéroport traffic down by -5.5%.



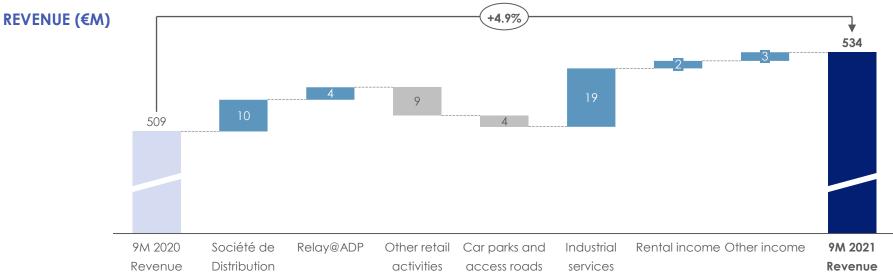


PARIS AÉROPORT QUARTER TRAFFIC COMPARED TO 2019

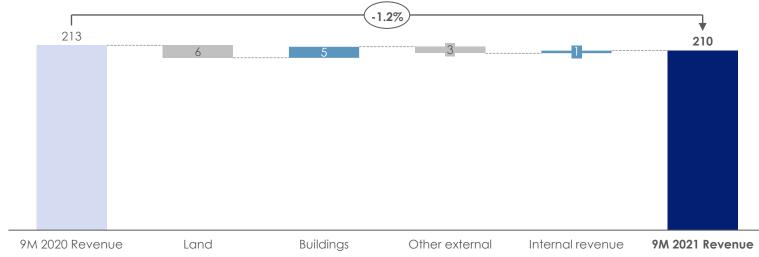
- This increase in revenue from SDA (up by +5.7%) & Relay (+22.7%) more than compensating the decline in revenue from advertising (-45.6%);
- The increase in revenue from Industrial services (+24.2%).
- Sales/Pax⁽¹⁾ at €21.1, up by +13.4%.

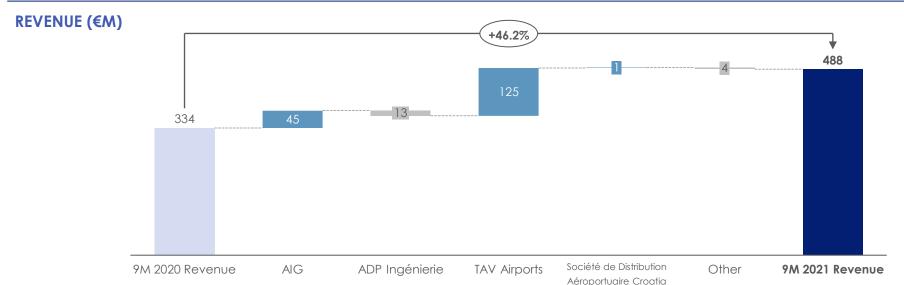

- The increase in revenue from TAV Airports, up by +55.2%, due to the integration into the accounts of the management company of Almaty airport for +57 million euros, and the increase in TAV Airports' revenue from airport assets and services companies due to the recovery of traffic.

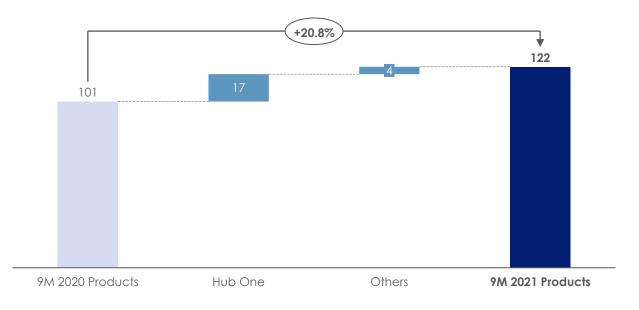
