In 2022, the group handled through its brand Paris Aéroport 86.7 million passengers at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and Paris-Orly, and nearly 193.7 million passengers in airports abroad. The mission of the Paris 2024 Organising Committee for the Olympic and Paralympic Games is to plan, organise, finance and deliver the Olympic and Paralympic Games in Paris in 2024 in accordance with the host city contract signed between the International Olympic Committee (IOC), the French National Olympic and Sports Committee (CNOSF) and the City of Paris.

The Olympic and Paralympic Games represent the world's premier sporting events with unparalleled media impact. They bring together 10,500 Olympic and 4,400 Paralympic athletes, from 206 and 182 delegations respectively from five continents. They are watched by more than 13 million spectators and 4 billion television viewers worldwide through over 100,000 hours of TV broadcasting. Amongst all the world's sporting, economic and cultural events, this constitutes an unparalleled event whose power multiplies its impact.

Created in January 2018, Paris 2024 is chaired by Tony Estanguet, three-time Olympic champion. It is governed by a Board of Directors (BOD), which brings together all the founding members of the project: the CNOSF, the City of Paris, the State, the Île-de-France Region, the CPSF, the Greater Paris Metropolis, Seine Saint-Denis Departmental Council, representatives of the local authorities concerned with the Games, civil society and social partners.
